This young man was born June 12, 1951 - he is now 20 years old. He was in the Coast Guard from January 1970 to December 1971. He has been a Phoenix resident since 1960 until entering the Coast Guard. While in Guam last year, he served as an Assistant Scoutmaster in Troop 32 at the Naval Station from February to December 1971.

His father, David E. Ellington, assisted in Cubbing, and Scouting, about ten years ago but to the best of our knowledge was not registered.

With this additional information, are you still sure this is the same David J. Ellington in the Confidential file?

We will withhold action pending your reply.

This is the first time I have had to write this sort of letter and I am not completely sure of the correct procedure, however, here is the information I have to date relative to David Joseph Ellington, who should be refused the opportunity to register with the Boy Scouts of America in the future.

He has been given a General Discharge from the U.S. Coast Guard on 20th December, 1971, for a "character and behaviour disorder".

In an interview with Lt. Commander Hunsucker (Administrative Officer for the U.S.C.G. detachment on Guam) I was informed that David Ellington is a "Class I" homosexual having admitted to two previous homosexual contacts prior to the incident leading to his discharge. The "discharge incident" involved two minor male children of a Coast Guard ship Commanding Officer.

Identifying information is as follows:

David Ellington was registered in Troop 23 sponsored by BPO Elks Lodge #1281, Agana, Guam as an Assistant Scout Master.

He was informed that he would not be able to register in the future as a member of the BSA by Lt. Commander Hunsucker, and he has left Guam now and will probably be living in Pheonix, Arizona at the above address.
