
Dear Paul:


Dear Paul:

Lynden man faces 6 felony charges

A man who has been a Boy Scout troopmaster and a state-paid foster parent is being held in Whatcom County Jail in lieu of \$5,000 bail, facing six felony indecent liberties charges.

Arnold Neuman, 41, Lynden, made an initial appearance in Whatcom County Superior Court Friday, when bail was set. He will be formally arraigned next Friday, according to Prosecutor David McEachran.

The prosecutor said Neuman is charged with abusing at least six boys, ranging in age from 9 to 11. Two of the boys were in a foster home Neuman has, McEachran said. The other boys are believed to have been in his Boy Scout troop.

Usually, county residents are released on personal recognizance after making an initial appearance. Bail is required to make sure the defendant appears to face charges. While Neuman is a long-time resident, the seriousness of the charges made bail necessary, McEachran said.

Neuman was arrested Thursday by sheriff deputies investigating a tip supplied by the state Department of Social and Health Services, McEachran said.

Observation ordered for man who pleaded guilty

A man who was a Boy Scout troopmaster and a state-paid foster parent has been committed to Western State Hospital for observation as a sexual psychopath after he pleaded guilty to six felony counts of taking indecent liberties.

Arnold O. Newman, 41, Lynden, pleaded guilty in Whatcom County Superior Court Friday to abusing six boys ages 9 to 11. The court ordered the commitment to the hospital.

Two of the boys were in a foster home Newman has, Prosecutor David McEachran said. The other boys are believed to have been in his Scout troop.

Newman was arrested Sept. 23 by sheriff deputies investigating a tip supplied by the state Department of Social and Health Services, McEachran said.

Newman was held in custody until he posted a \$5,000 property bond bail. County-area residents are usually released on their personal recognizance after making a first appearance, but the seriousness of the charges against Newman prompted making bail necessary, McEachran said.
