Dear Gene:

Since our last conversation concerning Mark Dennis several things have taken place that I feel you should be familiar with.

1. When I received your call on Monday night and we (Cordis and myself) had the initial conversation with Mark and told him of the accusation, he denied it. We, at that time, restricted his activities. They remained restricted and supervised until Wednesday afternoon when he admitted the accusation was correct.

2. Upon admitting the accusation was correct and Mark leaving camp, being discharged by me was one and one half hours, most of it being used to pack his personal belongings.

3. Mark can no longer register with any council in the Boy Scouts of America, and in order to be a summer camp staff member, you must be a registered Scouter.

4. Mark has been relieved of his position in the seminary and will not be able to continue in this line as a profession. (As a by-line, his great uncle, the Bishop of Central Illinois, relieved him of his position.)

5. Mark is now in a long-term therapy session, working through the Diocese office here in La Crosse.

You should also know that two groups of people were notified of Mark's actions. They were my Scout Executive (Tuesday morning) and Father Bob Cook, La Crosse Diocese office (Wednesday afternoon). The actions taken by both groups I have mentioned above.

Father Bob Cook has also expressed his deep regret and said he would help the [REDACTED] family and Mark in any way he can.

I will close by saying that if you feel I can do anything else, please feel free to call or write. I am enclosing an extra copy of this letter for you to give the parents of [REDACTED]. If you want me to write directly, please feel to ask.

On Thursday, July 23, 1981, an incident involving our son and Mark Dennis, the camp's chaplain occurred which we feel should be brought to your attention.

Our son, [REDACTED], attend chapel services after lunch on Thursday. When services were over [REDACTED] & other boys met the chaplain at his car to get information regarding the religion award. After taking addresses & phone numbers he asked [REDACTED] to remain and asked the other boys to leave. One of [REDACTED] friends, [REDACTED], wanted to wait for [REDACTED], but the chaplain became insistent that he leave. He then asked [REDACTED] if he would come to his lodge saying he wanted [REDACTED] to help him ~~sort~~ fix his stereo. At the cabin, [REDACTED] helped him plug in the stereo. They talked. The chaplain started to talk about his girlfriend and sex. He took [REDACTED] into the bedroom area, undressed him and sexually molested him. He kept [REDACTED] at the cabin for nearly 2 hours letting him go when [REDACTED] said he had to get back to the campsite for camp cleanup duties. The chaplain warned [REDACTED] not to tell ~~the~~ anyone. [REDACTED] tells us he was terrified by the incident & was afraid to tell the "scoutmaster".
