Men given prison term

Patrick C. Farrell, 41, of 111 Hammes Ave., has been sentenced to 24 months at the state prison in Vandalia and placed on five years probation by Associate Circuit Judge John C. Mason of LaSalle County.

Farrell was charged with taking indecent liberties with a child. The incident involved two boys last Sept. 9 at a LaSalle County camping ground.

Judge Mason stipulated that the conditions of the probation included Farrell having periodic psychiatric examinations and he not be allowed in the company of any minor child without a responsible adult being present.

However, although you state in your letter that there is evidence of homosexuality, we really need more detailed information. Just what actually happened? What situation or incidents occurred to cause these charges to be made? We would very much appreciate your writing us a letter giving us the complete story and also include written documentation from those directly involved. This substantiating evidence is important, should this man ever again attempt to register in the Scouting program.

Enclosed is a confidential record sheet which we would appreciate your filling out and returning to us, together with the above information. Unless we receive the above requested material, we will not be able to keep this man's name on the Confidential File.
