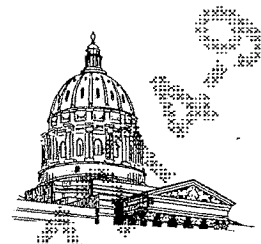


This hopefully will conclude our correspondence and material for your files with reference to David C. Fenton, recently registered as Scoutmaster of Troop 95, Tipton, Missouri and also registered as an Explorer Advisor of Post 95, Warrensburg, Missouri, a member of the Kansas City Area Council, Kansas City, Missouri.

My previous letter indicated that Fenton had been accused and with verification by parents of boys of immoral acts with the Scouts. Unfortunately, they are most reluctant to be heard or to extend in writing the details of the acts that Mr. Fenton performed. However, in visiting with the Chairman of the Troop Committee, the following act was described to me and was reported to him by the parents of one Scout following the act performed by Mr. Fenton.

"On a recent camping trip, Scoutmaster Fenton camped away from the Troop with one Scout in his tent. During the hours following retiring and before sleep Scoutmaster Fenton had the Scout lay on his stomach with Mr. Fenton laying on him and entered the body of the Scout through the rectum and commenced to perform the sex act. Following the camp out the Scout reported to his mother that he was extremely ill and under questioning, reported to his mother that he was going to have a baby because of the act Scoutmaster Fenton performed. This was reported to the Troop Committee Chairman and then to the Council office.

I hope the above information is sufficient, however, if not I will try to do what I can to provide the necessary information for your files.

INSTRUCTIONS TO THE LOCAL COUNCIL

Separation notices should be sent to the national office during the charter year for the following reasons only:

1. When a boy or adult transfers from one unit to another within the council (pack to pack, pack to troop, troop to troop, troop to post, post to post).
2. When an adult changes position within a unit or council.
3. When a Boy Scout or Explorer reaches 18 years of age

and registers as an assistant Scoutmaster or an associate Advisor.

4. When a member dies (please include his last address).
When a boy or an adult pays a registration fee, he is entitled to membership until the expiration date indicated on his membership certificate.

Separation notices must not be sent to the national office at the time of reregistration or for unregistered units.

For a boy transferring to a new unit, submit an additional enrollment to add him to his new unit. This separation notice only separates him from his previous unit, it does not add him to his new unit.
