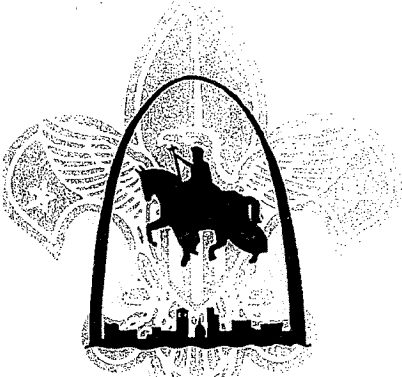

Adverse Situation Report  
Mr. LeRoy "Bud" Davis

The following is a report on an adverse situation that came to our attention during the past week. It concerns a Mr. LeRoy "Bud" Davis, an adult, and [REDACTED] a Scout in Troop #125 at Peabody-Darst Apartments.

Mr. Davis has held adult leadership capacities in our council as follows:

- 1) Explorer Advisor of Explorer Post #125 - Peabody-Darst Apts. - 7/'58 thru 4/'63.
- 2) Troop Committeeman of Troop #125 - Peabody-Darst Apts. - 5/'59 thru 4/'60.
- 3) Pack Committeeman of Pack #848 - LaSalle Baptist - 2/'62 thru 1/'63.
- 4) Troop Committeeman of Troop #848 - LaSalle Baptist - 2/'63 thru current.
- 5) Cubmaster of Pack #848 - LaSalle Baptist - 2/'63 thru current.

On Thursday, July 25, 1963, at which time Special Services - TB was at week camp at Camp May, Mr. Davis appeared at camp. He had driven the parents of [REDACTED] out to camp for parents night. He requested that he be allowed to stay in camp as he had been active in our units in the past and knew many of the boys and leaders. Since we had a paid reservation that was unused we agreed.

On Friday, July 26, 1963 at approximately 8:00 P.M. [REDACTED] asked Charles Stegen where I was. Mr. Stegen told him that Mr. Davis had driven my son and I into town as my son was sick and I thought he should be home. [REDACTED] said, "You mean he went with that "Q-U-E-E-R"?" Mr. Stegen told him that this is not the thing to say about anyone and is very serious. The boy told him that he knew it and then told Mr. Stegen that Mr. Davis had made improper advances toward him. He also told Mr. Stegen that [REDACTED] SM-Tr. 131 knew about Mr. Davis. Mr. Stegen questioned Mr. [REDACTED] and Mr. [REDACTED] stated that Mr. Davis had propositioned him on a previous occasion. Mr. Stegen told Mr. [REDACTED] that they would have to discuss this and take action on my return.

At approximately 11:00 P.M. on Friday, July 26, 1963 Mr. Stegen advised me of his findings. We immediately placed a close watch on Mr. Davis. We also questioned Mr. [REDACTED] at this time and advised him that suspicions of this nature should be brought to our attention immediately.

On Saturday, July 27, 1963 I held a conference with [REDACTED]. He stated to me that Mr. Davis had on several occasions made improper advances toward him. I cautioned the boy, advising him of the seriousness of his accusations. He stated he realized the seriousness of the situation but that he was telling the truth. I told him he should tell his parents as soon as he got home which would be later the same day. The boy asked me to tell his father as he was scared. I told him to have his father call me and I would tell him what the boy told me.

In the evening on Saturday, July 27, 1963, Mr. [REDACTED] father called me and I told him what his son had told me. I also advised him that I would make a full report to you and requested him to keep me informed of developments. I also advised him that any other action would have to come from him.

At 10:00 A.M. on Sunday, July 28, 1963 I called Mr. [REDACTED] at which time he told me that he talked to his son and believed the story. He stated at that time that they were not going to file charges.

At approximately 8:00 P.M. Sunday, July 28, 1963 I was advised that Mrs. [REDACTED] had been trying to reach me. I called her and she advised me that they had changed their minds and were going to file charges.

On subsequent calls between Mr. and Mrs. [REDACTED] and myself at approximately 2:00 A.M., 6:00 A.M., 7:00 A.M. on Monday, July 29, 1963 I received the following information as stated by Mr. and Mrs. [REDACTED]

- 1) The parents filed a complaint and an arrest order was issued.
- 2) Mr. Davis was picked up in St. Charles, Mo. at approximately 9:00 A.M. Monday, July 29, 1963.
- 3) The police asked our assistance through Mr. [REDACTED] in obtaining dates of camping trips.
- 4) Mr. Davis admitted the charges to the police.
- 5) It was discovered that he was on probation from Clayton on similar charges.
- 6) Mr. and Mrs. [REDACTED] were advised to drop the charges as the time lapse was too great.
- 7) All charges were dropped.

I have assured Mr. and Mrs. [REDACTED] that because of the suspicion cast on Mr. Davis, the council will not allow Mr. Davis to hold a certificate of membership. I also asked them to file a letter of complaint with you.
