Teacher sentenced to life for molesting 6 boys

A former elementary school teacher who was active in Boy Scouts and Little League was sentenced Monday to life in prison for sexually assaulting six boys.

Roger Lutz, who taught third grade at Cross Bayou Elementary School in Pinellas Park, will have to spend at least 25 years in prison before he is eligible for release.

When he leaves prison, he will spend an additional 20 years on probation and will be prohibited from working with any children under the age of 15.

As he struggled to hold back tears, Lutz told Circuit Judge Helen Hansel that he didn't mean to harm the children. He said the assaults were the "result of stress, instability and what I feel is severe emotional illness."

Lutz, 25, also apologized to the children's parents, who were sitting in the courtroom. "Those children meant a lot to me," he said. "I know they loved and trusted me. I'm very sorry I let them down."

None of the children's parents spoke during the court hearing. Afterward, several said they were glad Lutz is being sent to prison, but they wished his sentence were longer. Assistant State Attorney Robert Lewis had asked Judge Hansel to sentence Lutz to at least four consecutive life sentences, with no hope of release for 100 years.

ONE FATHER said Lutz assaulted his 3-year-old son while he was supposed to be tutoring him. Because of the attack, the father said he has moved his family so his son could leave Cross Bayou Elementary and attend another school. He said

the boy is now afraid of tutors, has low self-esteem and is seeing a psychologist.

Other children who were assaulted also are being treated by psychologists or psychiatrists, Lewis said.

Before his arrest, Lutz taught math, science and social studies and was in his second year at Cross Bayou. He previously taught part of a year at Maximo Elementary in St. Petersburg.

The Pinellas County School Board suspended him without pay last April after he was indicted by a grand jury. His annual contract was not renewed last spring.

The boys Lutz was charged with assaulting or fondling were from 7 to 10 years old. The assaults occurred from January 1984 until March 1985, when Pinellas Park police arrested him after a child told his parents that Lutz had fondled him.

Lutz met one of the boys in the Big Brothers program. Some of the others were students at the elementary school, where some of the incidents occurred. Prosecutors said Lutz, who pleaded no contest to the charges last month, had admitted to all but one of the charges against him.

ON MONDAY, several of Lutz's friends from school, Little League and Boy Scouts praised his work with young people. All of them asked Judge Hansel to require that Lutz get mental counseling and give him an opportunity to contribute to society again.

"I'm convinced that Roger did not go into teaching for the wrong motives," said Bob Bradshaw, a lawyer and one of Lutz's former teachers. "He went into it for all of the right reasons."

Judge Hansel ordered the counseling, but she told Lutz that he appeared to seek out situations where he would be near children. She said the assaults violated the trust that parents and the children themselves had placed in him.

Grand jury indicts teacher in sexual battery on 2 boys

A 25-year-old school teacher at Cross Bayou Elementary School was indicted by a Pinellas County grand jury Thursday on four counts of sexual battery on a child 11 years old or younger.

Roger Eric Lutz, of 4954 Beach Drive SE in St. Petersburg, was accused of three counts of sexual battery against one boy and one count against another. The incidents allegedly occurred between January 1984 and March 1985.

Lutz, a third-grade teacher described as an "exceptional young teacher" by his principal, was arrested by Pinellas Park police in March on a charge of molesting a student. He was one of five men indicted Thursday on charges involving children.

The grand jury also indicted four people on first-degree murder

charges, including a 64-year-old woman who called police to report that her tenant had staggered into her house bleeding and died there.

Mary Lee Richardson, of 12060 135th Ave. near Largo, was indicted in the Feb. 15 stabbing death of Amos King, 51. Police said they suspected that Mrs. Richardson stabbed King after an argument over rent payments.

Others charged with murder in indictments Thursday are:

✓ James Wallace Jr., 45, 1026 N Missouri Ave. in Clearwater, in the shooting death of Wilton Lee, 54, a Morton Plant Hospital housekeeping supervisor, in a bar room fight Feb. 1.

✓ Jeffrey A. Webb, 26, and William M. Taylor, 25, both of St. Petersburg, in the fatal stabbing of Joseph Norman Miller, 27, which police say occurred as Miller's twin brother fought off intruders at the Miller home on Jan. 24.

Man charged with sex assault on boy

A 70-year-old St. Petersburg man was arrested Thursday and charged with sexually assaulting a 5-year-old boy in the man's home.

Clarence Arthur Torowski, of 2661 20th St. N in St. Petersburg, was charged with a lewd and lascivious act in the presence of a child and with involuntary sexual battery.

Torowski was arrested after the boy's parents complained to police.

According to detective Paula Zitzelberger, the boy was coaxed into a neighbor's home Thursday afternoon with the promise of candy. When the boy returned home with the candy, his parents asked him where he got it, the detective said.

The boy explained what had happened, and the parents called police.

Judge won't lower bail for teacher accused of molesting

A judge refused this morning to lower the \$230,000 bail of a third grade schoolteacher who is accused of molesting students.

Roger Eric Lutz, who was suspended with pay from his teaching job at Cross Bayou Elementary School in Pinellas Park early this month when he was arrested, has never been in trouble with the law before and is so well-liked in his profession that a legal defense fund has been established for him, said Lutz's attorney John Stewart.

But prosecutors brought forth a group of parents and police officials who called the 25-year-old teacher a

"danger" and said Lutz might hamper an ongoing investigation by law enforcement if he were granted his freedom.

Assistant State Attorney T.R. Unice said Lutz may be facing additional capital sexual battery charges. Unice and Assistant State Attorney Robert M. Lewis indicated that more parents have contacted their office and additional charges are pending.

Little more than a week ago, Lutz was arrested and accused of sexually molesting a 9-year-old male student. A few days later, police accused him of molesting three other young boys.

The brown-haired, bearded man was brought into the courtroom of

Pinellas Circuit Judge Crockett Farnell this morning wearing handcuffs and the dark blue jail garb given to inmates. He said nothing during the hearing on a motion for lower bail.

Although Stewart's motion noted that Lutz is a Boy Scout leader, a manager of a Little League baseball team, a Big Brother and active in his church, prosecutors said some of those activities involve children and should not be considered in Lutz's favor.

St. Petersburg police officer Paula Zitzelberger told Farnell she knew of Lutz.

"He is a very intelligent, very likeable person, but Mr. Lutz is a child molester," the officer said, adding that more parents are con-

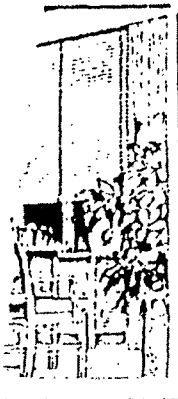
tacting police with allegations against Lutz.

"I think it would be absolutely inappropriate to let him out while our investigation is going on," she said. She also pointed out that allowing Lutz to go free on bond could put him in danger.

Stewart said his telephone "has been ringing off the hook" with calls from persons who want to help Lutz. Many are schoolteachers, Stewart said later. Some have even established a legal defense fund for Lutz, he said.

Farnell denied the request to reduce bail, but told Stewart he could make the request again after the investigation by the state attorney's office is ended.

Cross Bayou schoolteacher accused of another sex offense

Roger Eric Lutz, a third-grade teacher at Cross Bayou Elementary School who faces charges of child molesting, was accused Monday of fondling yet another boy.

Lutz, 25, now is accused of six offenses, and his bail has been raised \$50,000 to \$280,000.

The most recent accusation stems from an incident that St. Petersburg police investigators say occurred last December at Lutz's apartment, 4954 Beach Dr. SE. A 9-year-old boy who was spending the night with Lutz allegedly was fondled, according to a police report.

As parents of children who have had contact with Lutz learn of the charges, more complaints are filed, police said. "I'm sure many parents have queried their children. I know I would," said St. Petersburg police detective Paula Zitzelberger.

But, Mrs. Zitzelberger said, police have not solicited complaints against Lutz. "The knowledge is there. We don't want it to look like a witch hunt," she said.

Many children involved in the alleged acts did not know each other, Ms. Zitzelberger said. "He has many contacts with chil-

dren and the complaints are coming from all different areas."

Lutz is a Boy Scout leader, a manager of a Little League baseball team, a Big Brother and active in his church. Police said Lutz was acting as a Big Brother in at least two overnight incidents that allegedly involved fondling and oral sex.

On Monday, the same day the additional count was filed, Pinellas Circuit Judge Crockett Farnell refused to lower Lutz's bail when a group of parents and police officers called Lutz a "danger."

Lutz has been suspended with pay from the Pinellas Park school where he taught since his arrest March 17. Pinellas Park police accused Lutz of committing lewd and lascivious acts against a 9-year-old student. Three days later, Pinellas Park police added a count of lewd and lascivious with indecent acts upon a child. That charge stemmed from an incident that allegedly occurred at school, police said.

A week ago, St. Petersburg police accused Lutz of two counts of sexual battery and one count of lewd and lascivious acts. The charges involved boys ages 8 and 10.

Additional sexual assault charges are filed against elementary school teacher

A Cross Bayou Elementary School teacher, already in jail on charges he molested a 9-year-old student, was accused by police Wednesday of assaulting three other boys.

Roger Lutz, 25, of 4954 Beach Dr. in St. Petersburg, was charged with three counts of lewd and lascivious acts and two counts of sexual battery Wednesday. He remained in Pinellas County jail Wednesday night in lieu of \$230,000 bail.

Sunday, police had charged Lutz, a third-grade teacher, on two counts of sexual misconduct involving the 9-year-old student. After the arrest was publicized, some students told their parents of similar alleged acts and the parents contacted police, according to Pinellas Park police officer Ron McKenzie.

Two students at Cross Bayou, aged 7

and 9, told police they were fondled at the school, McKenzie said. One says it occurred twice a week since Feb. 1. The other boy, McKenzie said, "says it occurred just about every day either during or after school" since the school year began.

St. Petersburg police also charged Lutz on Wednesday in connection with assaults on another boy, police said. The boy is not a student at the school. Lutz is charged with one charge of lewd and lascivious conduct and two counts of sexual battery in that case.

Lutz, described by his principal as an "exceptional young teacher," was suspended with pay following his arrest Sunday.

Before his arrest, he taught math, science and social studies at Cross Bayou. A single man, Lutz also was involved in the Boy Scouts and the Big Brothers program and is a Little League coach, school officials said.
